



Other things that may help you locate your lost pet:

<p>are? Post fliers in your neighborhood</p> <p>are? Visit the local vet or animal shelter and you'll find a veterinarian who can help with your pet's microchip. Or, go online to a pet site about your pet's microchipping.</p> <p>are? Check Craig's "lost and found" pets. Someone may have found your pet and taken it to a shelter.</p> <p>are? Post a Lost Dog message on your Facebook page. Facebook is public, and posts go up to "share."</p> <p>are? Check www.lostdogregistry.net. Search found reports and place a lost report.</p> <p>are? Check http://www.pet-connect.org/Search found reports and place a lost report.</p> <p>are? Visit other area animal shelters and post lost pet notices;</p> <p>are? Check local newspapers for "found" pet advertisements; place a lost pet ad (which is sometimes free of charge)</p> <p>are? Don't give up hope.
