

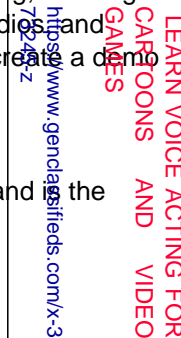
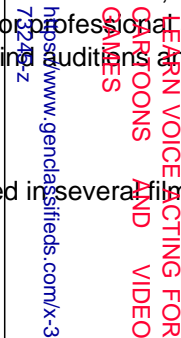
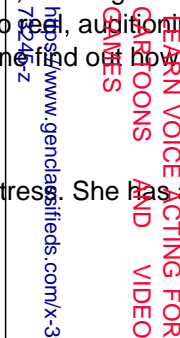
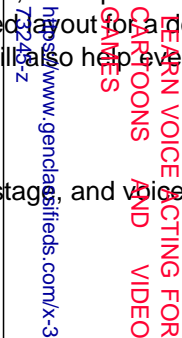
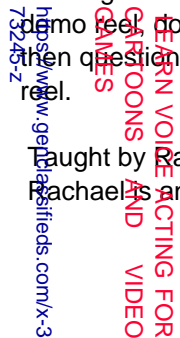


Have you ever heard a voice in a cartoon and thought "I want to do that!"
