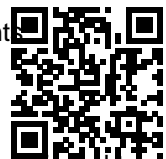
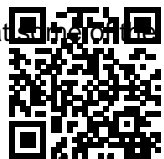
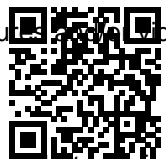
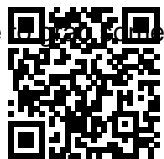
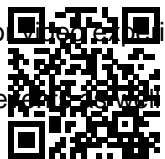
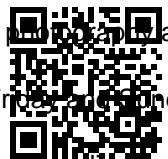
I'm looking for an assistant and NOT other DJs
