\*\*\*Upon diagnoses of FeLV+ many kittens are euthanized. I am trying to stop this from happening to at least one kitten, although I have room for up to three, (if a litter and more then three, will take in all). I am becoming very deterred in my search as contactors have not been genuine, claiming to have FeLV+ kittens but in truth do not. If I am forced to remove my post due to those who are insincere, it could cost a kitten their life.

Acceptable status of new kitten:

FeLV+ & FIV+ : Yes  
FeLV+ only : Yes  
FIV+ only : No (kitten could contract FeLV)

FeLV (feline leukemia virus), rarely live past two years when contracted at birth, progressive virus. Exposed kittens are at high risk of contracting.

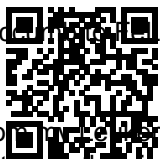
FIV (feline immunodeficiency virus ~ aids), many years, slow acting virus. Harder to contract.



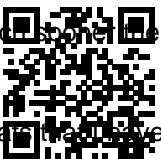
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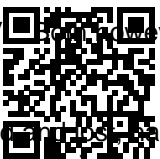
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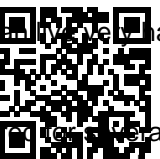
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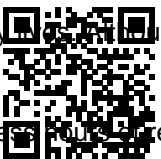
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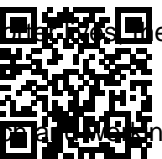
