Available October or November 1st .This shop is located in the Marketplace shopping Village on the busy corner of Hwy 32 & Puetz in Oak Creek. The Village was built in 1975 to resemble an 1800's Village. These are condo's with living quarters above each unit . Made for the artist / crafts person to live above their business.

Most buildings are no longer used that way . This building has a tenant living above and only the shop is available.

The available building is the "Little Red Schoolhouse " with the bell tower on the first photo. The view on that photo is the inside mall entrance. The second photo is from the parking lot entrance which is used exclusively by the current business a Yoga studio.

The next photo's show the room you would enter into from the parking lot entrance, which is $10 \frac{1}{2}$ wide X 21 with an attached area 6 X 8. It is 268 sq. ft. There is carpeting in this room and several track lights . It is being used now as entrance / waiting room and office.

The next room pictured is used as the Yoga room , so it's totally empty. it measures 16 1/2 X 20 or 330 Sq. The floor is plank look vinyl , easy to clean.

There are full view french doors leading to the mall. The doors have built in blinds. There is also a side door in this room. Current tenant does not use the mall entrance.

The stairs pictured lead downstairs to the finished basement. To the right of the stairs , there is a small room which was used as a massage room. It measures 8.5×12.5 or 106.25 sq. it has carpeting , the entire floor downstairs has vinyl square flooring , blue. There is a storage space under the stairs , and the bathroom is down here. it has black fixtures. and it is 5' X 5' or 25 sq.
